

# CANADA'S CLEAN50

We don't just have to ADAPT...

The Canada's Clean50 Honour is awarded annually to the 50 individual leaders (and small teams) who have contributed the most to enhancing sustainability and clean capitalism in Canada over the prior 2 years. Now in its fifth year, nearly 300 remarkable individuals have been recognized for their significant accomplishments and leadership.

The annual Clean50 Summit brings together sustainability, policy and clean tech experts from disparate Canadian endeavors, seeking to enhance opportunities for these leaders find new and innovative ways to collaborate. These individuals collectively lead the fight against climate change and embrace a low carbon future, whilst at the same time, improving both corporate and environmental performance, and enhance Canada's prosperity.

Clean50 leaders come from many backgrounds. The majority, drawn from commercial enterprises, are professionals who possess a deep understanding of sustainability and how to adapt those learnings to the benefit of their organizations. And in the process, helping them to increase profit and resiliency – and become more attractive to both employees and investors. But to be successful, those organizations' efforts need government and energy utility support, clean technology to drive down emissions, and the technical knowledge shared by academics and environmental NGOs (ENGOS). Hence the need for a Clean50 Summit – where these exemplary individuals can learn from each other, collaborate and accelerate progress.

- Amongst many other things, individual honourees this past year have led organizations or efforts that have:
- Saved the ELA (Experimental Lakes Area)
  - Accelerated the efforts of 200+ Clean Tech companies, that in one year raised \$112 m in capital, generated \$83 m revenue, and created over 1,300 jobs
  - Started four different clean tech companies
  - Led over 60 academics in the creation of a blueprint for Canada's sustainability
  - Conserved 410 GWh of electricity

- Announced and implemented a price on Carbon
  - Created a new oil sand mining process that uses no water, and generates 80% less GhG than traditional methods
  - Provided clean electricity to 45,000 homes
  - Installed over 400 electric vehicle charging stations along the Trans Canada Highway
  - Diverted over 580,000 computer and IT assets from landfill
